	 As one pod is presenting their assigned battle, students will add the important information relayed to them about that particular battle onto their "Important Battles During the American Revolutionary War- Notes" sheet.
35 min.	After each group presents they will find their battle name poster and add it to "The Road to American Independence" timeline.
10 min.	Independent response: "Why do you feel the colonists didn't quit when they were losing the battles and the lives of their countrymen?" The entire class will be 1 minute of "think time" to process the question. Then independently on their "Response" sheet
10 min.	Historical Figure Project: "Now that we have learned about how the American Colonist decided to declare their independence and all the important battles that they engaged in to fight for what they believed in, I would like us to focus on the people involved that made this happen." *paper passer will hand out the "Historical Figure Research Project" packet.
	I will review the instructions and the expectations of this project and students will be given the opportunity to ask clarifying questions.

• I will give students 1 minute to look at the list of names and label their top 3 picks.

- I will project the list of historical figure names on the board, using the name sticks students will be called up to pick their historical figure.
- Once they have selected one they will head back to their desk and begin packing their bags
